

Our Long-Term Vision Has Become Reality!

e are proud and excited to announce that SafeHouse Denver has purchased a building to house the Extended Stay Program (ESP). The final step in our full continuum of care for survivors of domestic violence, ESP will provide qualified Emergency Shelter residents with short-term housing as they work to access more permanent living situations for themselves and their children.

When a survivor enters our Emergency Shelter, she is in a crisis situation, often leaving her whole world behind. Of the many challenges she must overcome to rebuild her life, housing can be the most difficult. In Metro Denver, multi-year waitlists for transitional housing, Section 8 or other government programs, high rental rates, competition for units, and high occupancy rates can seem like insurmountable challenges.

Set to open in early June of 2018, ESP will give survivors the additional time and space they need to achieve their longer-term housing goals. The two-bedroom





apartments in the six-unit building will provide residents with privacy and independence as they work toward their personal self-sufficiency goals. They will continue to have access to the individual case management, group support and advocacy that SafeHouse Denver, as well as our partner agencies, provide. They will be continuing their journey with strong, caring support.

The opportunity to move into ESP gives survivors more access to community resources and time to rebuild new lives, free of abuse and fear. Our hope is that each survivor will feel more in control of their own destiny - a feeling that may have eluded them for a long time while they experienced abuse. At the same time, the opening of ESP will allow SafeHouse Denver's Emergency Shelter to serve more adults, youth and children in acute crisis. As the only agency in the City and County of Denver providing both emergency shelter and non residential counseling for survivors of domestic violence, the increase in shelter beds will expand our reach into the community and benefit more survivors in the community.

The ESP would not be possible without the commitment of all of our amazing supporters. SafeHouse Denver's

selection as the 2017 recipient of Bank of America's Neighborhood Builder Award contributed significantly to our ability to purchase the ESP facility. The program provides \$200,000 in flexible funding over two years, as well as volunteer engagement, leadership development and capacity building. SafeHouse Denver has directed the first-year funding to the purchase of the building and second-year funding toward operating the program.

The ESP was also made possible through the incredible generosity of the **Anschutz Foundation**, who made the first leadership gift of \$200,000 at the start of the agency's capital fundraising effort, as well as the **Daniels Fund**, who awarded us the final \$200,000 grant that brought us to our \$1.2M goal. Other prominent foundation funders include: the **Fidelity Foundation**, **Nord Family Foundation**, **Gates Family Foundation**, **AJL Charitable Foundation** and **Fox Family Foundation**. Numerous individual and corporate donors generously contributed to the facility as well.

We look forward to keeping you informed as we work toward the opening of the ESP, and deeply appreciate your continued support of survivors of domestic violence.

Message from Our CEO



ear Friends,

What an exciting time to be a part of SafeHouse Denver! As our front page article highlights, with the purchase of our Extended Stay Program (ESP) facility in December, we are now poised to offer a full continuum of care for survivors of domestic violence and their children.

Soon after I assumed the position of CEO at SafeHouse Denver in January 2008, the Board and Staff met and crafted our vision of a separate

facility for Emergency Shelter residents who were out of immediate crisis. We envisioned a place that would offer them safety, access to community resources, and more time on their journey toward rebuilding their lives free from domestic abuse.

Before we had the opportunity to move forward, the economic downturn forced us to remain focused on our current programs and services, provided through the CAC and Emergency Shelter. It was 2012, our 35th Anniversary Year, when the Board, Management Team and I took initial steps to plan for our future Extended Stay Program. For the next few years, we focused on building an operating reserve fund to ensure that we would have the ability to sustain and support this much needed new program.

We launched our capital fundraising efforts in early 2016 with a \$1M goal to purchase, renovate and furnish an existing apartment building. As our campaign continued, we increased our goal to \$1.2M in order to create a capital reserve fund for future repairs and aesthetic improvements. We were very fortunate to purchase a building that is in pristine condition, lovingly cared for by the former owner of many years. The fact that we purchased the facility at the close of our 40th Anniversary Year is especially meaningful to me, both personally and professionally. Knowing that many families will ultimately achieve healthy, abuse-free lives motivated everyone involved with this effort to work tirelessly to reach this milestone! The strength and courage of the many survivors we serve inspired us, especially when it seemed that funding for ESP might be out of reach.

After dreaming of this new program for ten years, our vision has become a reality, one that will positively impact survivors of domestic violence for many years to come. When we open our ESP doors to qualified survivors in June, emergency shelter beds will turn over more quickly, allowing us to provide services to more individuals experiencing domestic violence in the community. This is truly another step forward in meeting our mission of helping adults, children and youth reclaim their right to a life free from domestic violence.

On behalf of our Board of Directors, Staff and the individuals we serve, thank you to everyone who contributed to our Extended Stay Program. We look forward to sharing much more about the program in future communications with all of our supporters.
